Authority Sewer Rates Increase Slightly

In an effort to continue to maintain our current operating system while covering increasing operating costs and capital expenses, the Borough of Conshohocken Authority Board of Directors, following careful analysis and discussion with our professionals, have found it necessary to institute a slight increase in sewer rates.

Effective with the first quarterly billing in

2018, our customers' rates will adjust from \$3.07 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.30 per 1,000 gallons. In 2017 the average billed water usage for all users was 36,726 gallons. At that rate, the average Equivalent Dwelling Unit would be charged approximately \$292.75 per year in 2018, or roughly \$8 more per year for the same high-quality service.

The Equivalent Dwelling Unit service

charge of \$45, which was reduced from \$67 in 2013, will remain the same.

The Authority had maintained the same sewer rates since 2009. Prior to that, the Authority's last rate increase was enacted in 1991. Moving forward, the Authority intends to review its rate structure every five years to determine if minimal rate increases are necessary.



The Authority Board met multiple times with its rate consultant, Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc., reviewed the firm's analysis, which included numerous rate increase scenarios. The Authority Board asked a multitude of questions before ultimately deciding to act on the most fiscally sound rate structure increase for the community and our Authority.

The decision was not taken lightly, according to Authority Board Chairman Felix Raimondo.

"Our goal as a board is to provide the best service for the lowest price possible," Raimondo said. "We realize that cost increases can be difficult, particularly for our seniors and others on fixed incomes."

To help lessen the impact of the rate increase and show continued appreciation for its customers, the Authority will continue to offer a discount for prompt payments. Customers who pay within the first 15 days will receive a \$4 prompt pay discount per bill per quarter, or \$16 savings per year.
